FATIMA

100th Anniversary

1. **THEN:** It was on May 13, 1917 that Mary appeared to nine-year old Lucia Santos and to her two cousins, Jacinta and Francisco Mario while they were herding sheep. They saw a woman, "brighter than the sun". She wore a white mantle, edged with gold, and held a rosary in her hand. Her message was for them to devote themselves to the Holy Trinity, and to pray the rosary every day to bring peace to the world and to end World War I. The second appearance occurred on June 13th, the feast of St. Anthony, the patron of the local church. Our Lady revealed in this apparition that Francisco and Jacinta would be taken to heaven soon, but Lucia would live longer to spread her message and devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Mary appeared to the children six times, usually on the 13th of the month. She continued to ask them to pray for peace, for the conversion of sinners, for the conversion of Russia, and for the spreading of devotion to her Immaculate heart. On October 13, 1917, the last apparition, there occurred the "miracle of the sun". While private revelations are not part of the deposit of faith, the Church has officially declared that Mary's apparition at Fatima is "worthy of belief" and celebrates her feast on May 13th in the official calendar of the Church.

2. **NOW:** How does the Lord want us to respond as we celebrate the 100th anniversary of this apparition? We can:

- Sign up at the parish office to bring home the Our Lady of Fatima statue for one week.
- Pray the rosary every day for peace in the Middle East, especially in Syria, Afghanistan, and Iraq, where ISIS and the Taliban are still causing acts of Terrorism.
- Pray for Russia's continued conversion from atheistic communism, as well as other communist countries, such as China, North Korea, and Cuba.
- Pray for the conversion of all sinners.
- Continue to spread devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and turn to her especially on the first Saturday of each month attending mass (9 am at our church).
