June 4th, Pentecost Sunday

John 20: 19 - 23 As we prepare to hear God's holy word today, let us listen to these stories of the movement of the Spirit in the early church and reflect on how they tell our own story as well. Then let us make our own words of the Pentecost Sequence: "Come, Holy Spirit, come!"



It is the birthday of the Church and the end of Easter Season. The feast commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles. They were no longer afraid and began to preach to the crowds gathered in Jerusalem. The spirit appeared to them in tongues of burning fire. We are celebrating Pentecost today because the apostles empowered by the Spirit did overcome their fears. And because of their boldness, all of history has been transformed by the message of God's love and salvation. *Are we open to "God's surprises"? Or are we closed and fearful before the newness of the Holy Spirit?*

The 50-day Party

The fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as one feast day, or better as one 'great Sunday'. The idea of the Easter season as one, great, 50-day long Sunday traces its origins to the eastern doctor of the Church, Athanasius; its recovery today ought to help us appreciate the Easter Season, and indeed the entire liturgical year, at greater depth.

Easter is not something that happens for 24 hours and ends when the leftover ham and chocolate bunnies are put away after dinner. Rather, "Easter" is one continuous 50 - day feast, one "great Sunday" and it should be lived that way with as much revelry as possible.
